

Matisse Kaleidoscopes

Henri Matisse was a French painter, known for using bright, bold and edgy colours. He created all sorts shapes and patterns using bits of paper cut into little pieces, to form a collage.

Today, we're going to make kaleidoscopes, decorated in the style of Henri Matisse!

You will need:

- 2 toilet rolls
- A piece of foil
- Scissors and glue pva glue
- Tape, pencil and ruler
- Sequins and glitter
- Cling Film



1. Fold your piece of coloured card in half, then half again. Using a pencil and ruler, draw a rectangle from the edge of the card, about 5 inches or as long as your toilet roll (measure).
2. Stick the pieces of card to the foil and cut them both. Then fold them in to make a triangle, tape the edges together.
3. Cut 2 eye pieces by drawing around the end of the tube to make a circle. Then cut it out, fold in half and draw a small circle in the centre, using a small object.
4. Cut a piece of cling film and tape it to the end of toilet roll so it sits flat. Sprinkle in some sequins and sparkly bits. Put your triangle inside and then tape the eye piece to the other end.
5. Cut a section from your other toilet roll and tape it on top of the eye piece end. Add some more sprinkles, then tape your second eye piece on top.
6. Then decorate the outside with cut outs of coloured paper, see if you can make a picture!
